Mentors Wanted!

If you are a parent or Leader, you may be inspired to register as a Mentor. Each team of girls in the Tech Girls Competition will be matched with a mentor and to qualify as a Mentor, you need to:





- Work in a STEM-related field
- Have a passion for technology
- Want to help a team of girls build confidence with technology and learn hands-on entrepreneurial skills
- Be available for an average of 1-2 hours each week online from 4 May until 24 July 2020
- Be willing to guide the team of girls to the information they need, adhering to deadlines etc
- Get a Working with Children Check (or equivalent) completed
- Register as a Mentor by 25 April 2020

NOTE: All team Mentors are to be female. This creates the opportunity for participants to access positive female industry role models during the program.

A common question asked is - 'Do I have to know how to code first'? The answer is no, there is no prior programming experience necessary for either the Girls or their Mentors.

I am the Girl Guides Queensland Coordinator for this year's Tech Girls competition, and I will be hosting a webinar on **Friday April 3 at 6pm - 6:45pm** and **Monday April 20 at 6pm - 6:45pm** to answer all your Questions.
