What is Lones?

Guiding conjures up images of camping, having fun, and campfires. Lone Guides do all these activities.

We meet by mail, email, internet meetings, apps and face-to-face at camps or other events.

Lone Guides are open to all girls and women from age 5 and up.

We work towards the same badges and awards and follow the same Australian Guide Program that all Girl Guides in Australia do.

The only difference is the way in which we meet and communicate.



A place for everyone

Lones has a suitable unit for each age group starting with our youngest guides through to our most experienced guides and adults.

Our units

'Markaling' for girls aged 5 - 8 (utilising posted mail, phone calls, webinars and email)

'Kintakirri' for girls aged 9 - 12 (email, post and webinars)

'Tirrikki' for girls aged 13 - 17 (email, post, Facebook and webinars)

'2nd Charleville Lones' is for girls enrolled at the Charleville School of Distance Education (email, post and webinars)

'Alkira' Olave Lones for women aged 18 – 29 (email, post, Facebook, apps and webinars)

'Diamond Jubilee' Trefoil Guild for adult members (post, email and face-to-face meetings where possible)

'Platinum Flyers' Trefoil Guild for adult members (email, apps and webinars)

What does it cost?

All members pay an annual membership fee that covers an individual with insurance, membership to Girl Guides Australia and the World Association. It also supports leader training and resources.

Each Guide also pays unit subs annually. These assist in the purchase of resources, badges and postage. Lone Guides have a reduced fee compared to other Guides.
